## ATTENTION: IMPORTANT STATE REQUIREMENTS TO ATTEND COLLEGE

**HEALTH INSURANCE** is mandatory for all students. When you register for classes, there will be a health insurance charge included on your account. You may view the insurance coverage by visiting <http://www.BollingerInsurance.com/stockton>.

### YOU HAVE TWO OPTIONS:

**1. Online Application:** If you want this health insurance you must complete an online application. If you do not have your own health insurance, you must enroll in the college plan offered by Bollinger Insurance.

**2. Online Waiver:** If you have your own private health insurance and **DO NOT** wish to participate in the college plan, you must submit an online waiver **within the first 30 days** of classes.

You will need your Z # (student ID) and PIN to access the forms. *If you do not submit an online waiver within the first 30 days of classes, the health insurance charge will remain on your account until it is paid and you will be automatically enrolled in the college health insurance plan.*

### IMMUNIZATION

All students born after January 1, 1957, must submit proof of the following immunizations prior to the first day of classes: two doses of MMR (measles, mumps, rubella). (Those students born prior to January 1, 1957, do not need to submit immunizations.) *In addition, all students residing in on-campus housing must submit proof of a meningitis vaccine prior to moving into housing facilities.* If you have any of your immunization documentations with you today, you may submit it to the Health Services Office (West Quad 108).
