LEADERSHIP EDUCATION AWARENESS DEVELOPMENT CERTIFICATION PROGRAM

Student involvement in academic and co-curricular activities is an essential part of today's educational experience. By completing a combination of the various academic courses, programs and co-curricular experiences listed herein, students will receive an official Leadership Education Awareness Development (L.E.A.D.) certification through the Office of the Dean of Students.

To achieve certification, the following criteria must be met:

- Earn 100 points with a minimum total of points in each tier
- Transfer students may use their previous courses and experiences to meet up to 50 points toward certification
- Must be a senior (96 credits minimum)
- Must have a minimum 2.75 cumulative GPA
- Must have no prior social or housing probation

Tier 1 – 10 minimum points total

6 points each	S.O.A.R
3 points each	Day of Service MLK Jr. Day of Service Organizational Participation
2 points each	Community Service ULTRA-Approved Workshops

Tier 2 – 30 minimum points total

7 points each	Professional Workshops
5 points each	Executive Board Leadership Positions College Internship Programs Professional Association Conferences: NASPA, NACA, ACUI
3 points each	Awards: ULTRA Distinguished Leadership, etc.

Tier 3 – 60 minimum points total

10 points each	Academic Courses (minimum 2; maximum 5) Related to leadership education
8 points each	Day of Leadership participation Institutional Leadership (Orientation, Talons, etc.)
5 points each	Membership in Leadership Honor Societies e.g., Order of Omega, Omicron Delta Kappa
