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Galloway Township, NJ – The Stockton Center on Successful Aging (SCOSA) is co-sponsoring a lecture for health care and social work professionals, "Is Aging the Same for Everyone?" at Stockton's Manahawkin Instructional Site on **Monday, Oct. 5**, from 1– 3:30 p.m.

Professionals are invited the lecture and discussion on aging experiences and health care disparities within the Lesbian Gay Bisexual Transgender (LGBT) older adult community. Dr. Carolyn Bradley, an associate professor of Social Work at Monmouth University, is the presenter. Her research interests are in the areas of spirituality, addiction recovery, aging and LGBT issues.

The Stockton Center on Successful Aging and AtlantiCare's PRIDE Employee Resource Group are co-hosting the event at the instructional site, 712 E. Bay Ave., Manahawkin, NJ.

Participants will develop knowledge and skills to enhance their relationship with LGBT older adults by providing insights and awareness that will create a more respectful understanding of the population. Through these trainings, the LGBT Older Adult Project hopes to assist providers in understanding and responding to the unique culture and language of specific consumers seeking services.

This seminar is free of charge and includes lunch. Upon completion, participants will receive two Continuing Education (CE) credits for social workers (in cultural competency), marriage and family therapists, licensed professional counselors and occupational therapists and two Contact Hours for nurses.
