- As of September 1, 2011, *all* students pursuing certification in ESL *must* complete 5 courses, i.e. EDUC 4201/5201; EDUC 4204/5204; EDUC 4710/5205; EDUC 5202; EDUC 5203. Note that due to cross-listing, the 5-course requirement may be a combination of undergraduate and graduate courses.
- As of September 1, 2011, the listings under “Former Course ID/Titles” above will no longer be accepted as ESL endorsement courses.
- Students who have begun courses under the former Program must see an advisor in the School of Education to ensure a smooth and optimal transition relative to Program completion.
- In addition to course requirements, students must meet all current state testing requirements to qualify for the ESL endorsement.
