Galloway Township, NJ - "Making 'Cents' of Financial Aid," a free presentation for parents and guardians of high school students planning to attend college, will be offered on **Wednesday, Nov. 19** at Kramer Hall in Hammonton, the instructional site of The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey.

Stockton's Director of Financial Aid Jeanne Lewis, a Hammonton resident, and Chris Connors, assistant director, will provide families with valuable information about the financial aid application process. Their presentation will cover the FAFSA application (Free Application for Federal Financial Aid), important deadlines, scholarship search ideas and financial aid programs (such as grants, loans and work).

Anyone who needs financial assistance to pay for college is urged not to miss this opportunity on Nov. 19 from 6 p.m. – 7 p.m. at Kramer Hall, 30 Front St. in Hammonton.

The presentation is part of Stockton's Kramer Hall Miniversity program, which provides local high school students with a variety of curricular lectures and/or workshops facilitated by experts on various topics.

Sessions are free and non-credit. There will be Q&A time following each workshop.

A Miniversity session called, "Opening the Door to College," will be held on **Wednesday, Dec. 3** from 6 p.m. – 7 p.m. Students are invited to hear first-hand advice from recent Stockton alumni Ginna Petrillo and Patrick Yetsko.

Petrillo handles event planning, marketing and promotional support for academic courses as well as educational, cultural and community programs at Kramer Hall.
